

Leighton victorious again

Leighton took the win, Sobbing was second and Zeitner placed third. Kosiski captured the fourth spot and Tad Pospisil of Norfolk rounded out the top 5.

Zach Zentner of Cedar Rapids lead a line of Off Road Speedway regulars. Zentner was ninth, Jim Johnson of Plainview took 10th, Chase Osborne of Norfolk placed 11th, Chris Johnson of Bloomfield took home 12th and Ben Sukup finished 13th.


