





Remsing breaks through, captures first career victory

Norfolk's Larry Remsing started at Riviera Raceway in 2008 and has posted several top 5s, but Saturday night he got his first victory.

Starting from the pole position, Remsing took off and said good bye to the 14-car field leading all 15 laps in a race that had no cautions.

Remsing had a top 5 in 200 and a couple in both 2009 and 2010 with the highest position at third place.

It was his first top 5 of this season in his four starts.

With Remsing setting the pace out front, the battle came for second place

between Jake Timm of Pierce and Derek Sehi of Neligh.

Timm had the outside pole and fell into second at the start with Sehi on his bumper.

The two ran nose-to-tail until Timm slid up in turn three on lap seven and Sehi dove to the inside.

For several laps, Sehi ducked underneath going into the turns but could not keep it low and drifted up the track and had to back off to avoid hitting Timm

Finally on lap 13, Sehi got the traction he needed and got alongside Timm to take the white flag.

Then on lap 14 Sehi run into turn one hard and got the car to stick on the low side and made the pass for position

Finally on lap 14, Sehi got the necessary grip to make the pass. Just as Sehi cleared Timm, Jeremy Hoskinson of Norfolk stuck his nose in the mix.

However, it was too late. Sehi took second, Timm held onto third and Hoskinson fourth.


Fifth went to Matt Haase of Norfolk, who was also banging bumpers with Hoskinson.
