Meyer, Koch repeats for the eighth time

Cameron Meyer's run for a national title in the Sport Compact continued as he won another feature.

The Pierce native led the final five laps for his eighth win.

Kandie Smidt of Norfolk started on the outside pole and led the first three laps. Cody Relitz of Norfolk, who was forced into the fourth turn guardrail on the second lap, recovered to lead the next four laps.

With a restart with six laps remaining it looked to be a three car shoot out with

Relitz leading, Meyer second and Shannon Pospisil of Norfolk third.

Meyer was alongside Relitz on lap seven before jumping out front. The battle then became for second between Relitz and Pospisil. Pospisil was running just inside Relitz and each lap was gaining more and more. On the white flag lap, Pospisil looked

to have Relitz on the inside when his right rear fell off bringing out the caution.

It then was a green-white-checked fin-

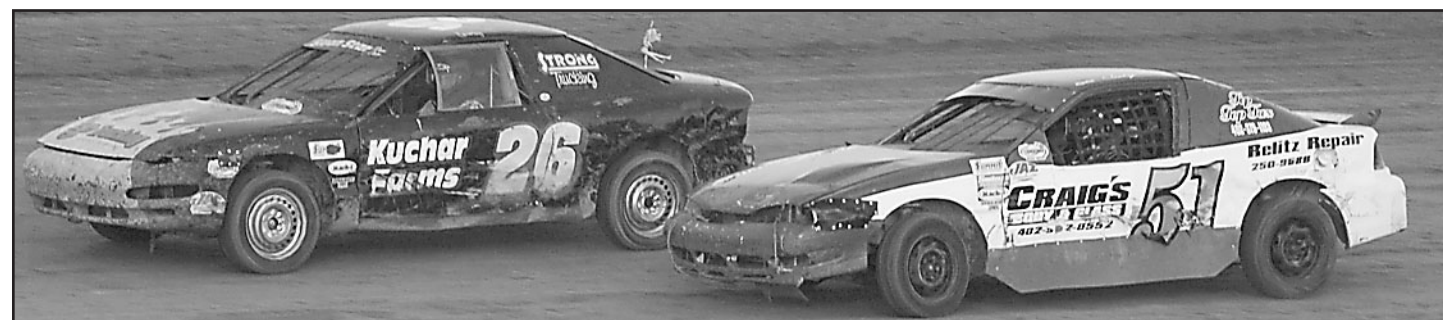

Wilkinson leads Neligh drivers

Neligh Hobby Stock driver Jason Wilkinson wrestled his stock car to the checkered flags last week when he lost a belt at the end of the race.

With no power steering or water pump, Wilkinson had to run hard to keep ahead of Derek Sehi of Neligh in the final run to the finish.

The engine held together and Wilkinson kept it pointed in the right direction to win his seventh feature of the season.

The four drivers from Neligh controlled the feature race as Tracy Buck led the first

seven laps with Travis Coover, Sehi and Wilkinson in tow. The four ran in the top 4 positions until Coover tangled with Jim Kimmel and Kevin Haase of Norfolk. Coover spun out with three laps remaining.

That set up a sprint to the finish. That is when Wilkinson said he lost his belt and had to hold off Sehi for the final laps.

Wilkinson won and Sehi was second. Buck finished third edging out Haase at the line. Kimmel crossed just behind Haase for fifth.



Kevin Haase (9) returned to the track to finish fourth in the feature holding off Jim Kimmel (17k).



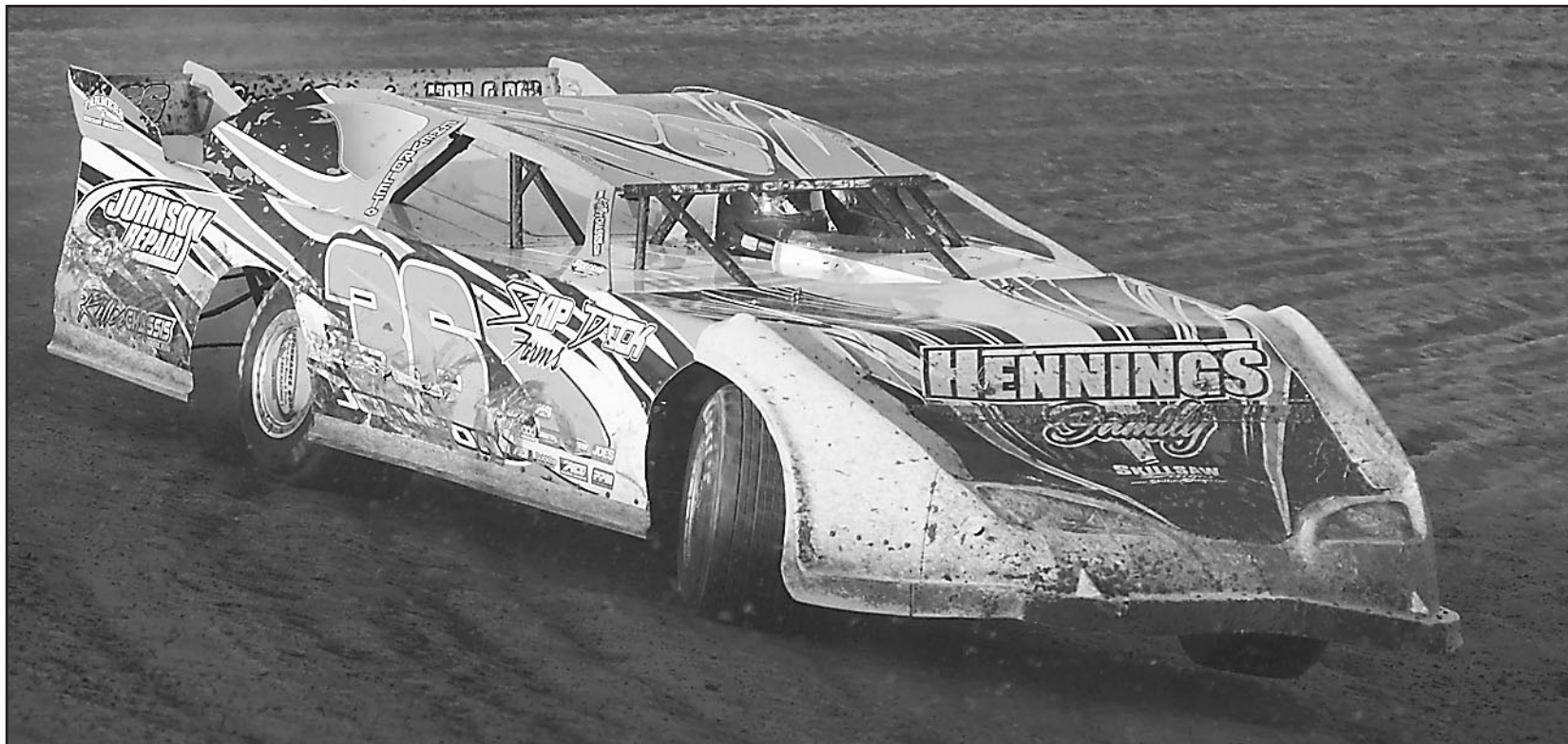
Jake Timm (18) took the heat race win and was seventh in the feature.

Johnson captures second feature

Grand National driver Jim Johnson of Plainview greeted his family in victory lane for the second time this season after pacing the field for the final eight laps.

Johnson started on the inside of the fourth row and running third after the fourth lap. Norfolk's BJ Haase led the first two laps before Chad Jensen of Norfolk, using the high line, jumped out front.

While traffic sorted out behind him, he pulled a six-car-length lead. By then Johnson was competing for second with Alex Banks of Norfolk.

Banks and Johnson went side-by-side for two laps before Johnson got the advantage on lap seven. For the next six laps, Johnson slowly reeled Jensen in.

Johnson caught Jensen about the time a caution came out during lap 14.

Jensen was leading, Johnson was

second and Robert Osborne of Norfolk was running third.

After another two cautions and no change in the order, the trio got back to racing.

Johnson had the inside line on Jensen, as Osborne waited for an opening.

Finally on lap 20, Johnson got the advantage on Jensen and completed the pass just before the final caution came out.

That set up a five lap shootout.

Johnson went to work on the bottom and slowly moved away from the rest. Jensen started working the inside line, as Osborne tried to get inside of him. On lap 23, Jensen slipped up the track exiting turn two and Osborne got alongside.

Osborne got the position a lap later on the white flag lap, when Jensen slid high again in turn two, giving Osborne the position.

Johnson won by six car lengths. Osborne was second and Jensen finished third.

Chris Johnson of Bloomfield was just behind Jensen for fourth, as Nick Opfer of Hartington rounded out the top 5.



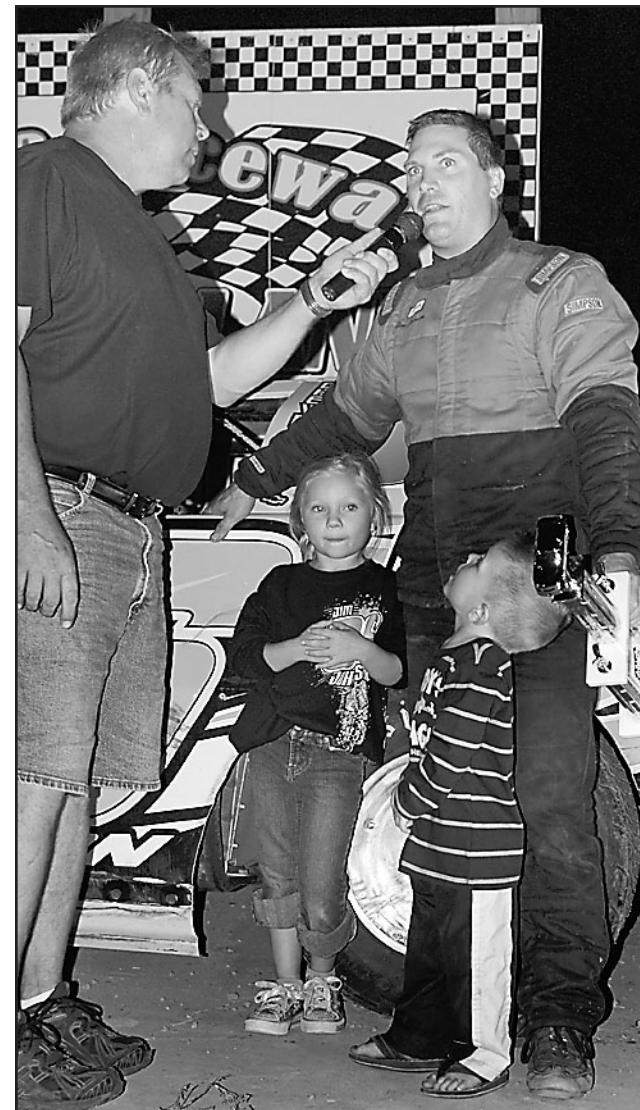
