

Ryan Rohde (95) took a second place finish, as Randy **Bertschinger** (90) took sev-


enth.

Haase leads the points battle with Rodgers second and Rohde third. Bruns sits fourth and Mielke rounds out the top 5.






TeJay Mielke (77) and Jared Rodgers (7) exit turn two in the second feature. Rodgers took two third place finishes. Mielke was second in the second feature.





Alex Banks (12) and Nick Opfer (34) run the second feature.





Hoskinson started on the inside of the second row, behind Jim Spencer of Norfolk. Spencer led the first two laps, when Hoskinson took over.

Only one caution slowed the field, but Hoskinson went on to lead the final laps. Defending track champion Tate Weinrich of Hoskins also moved passed Spencer for the second spot.

During the sixth lap, a caution was thrown. On the restart, Matt Haase of

Jeremy Hoskinson of Norfolk, Norfolk slipped past Spencer for the third spot. The three went 1-2-3 for the rest of the race.

> In the second feature, Kimmel overcame a broken axel in the first feature, to win the second feature.

Kimmel's misfortune in the opening feature gave him the pole position of the second one. He never looked back from there.

The fight came back in the second position with Jake Timm of Pierce, Derek Sehi of Neligh and later Weinrich.

Timm had the position first. On the

second lap, Sehi tried to get the runner-up position, but caution stopped the advancement.

On the restart, Timm held onto the position, but after the second caution Sehi got the upper hand and got by Timm for the second on lap six.

Three laps later Timm took a shot to get back to second, but Sehi counter to keep the spot.

Again after a caution, Timm lost another position, when Weinrich grab the position on lap 12.

Kimmel won. Sehi second and Weinrich third. Timm finished fourth.
