

The younger Wyman collected a \$1,000 pay day and Johnson's check was \$1,050. The racing series set up the pay out that second place receives \$50 more than first.


Third place went to Kosiski. Zeitner was fourth and Jason O'Brien of Atlantic, IA rounded out the top 5.
